

Prime Areas

The Prime areas underpin all learning in the Early Years.

Personal, social and emotional development

We will be focussing on increasing independence and doing things for ourselves.

Communication and language

We will be working on listening carefully and, when speaking, answering in sentences..

Physical development

Developing **fine motor** skills and practising correct letter formation.

PE: -core strength, travelling, footwork, balance, agility and object control.

In Term 4, the children will also need a warm tracksuit and trainers to be kept in school.

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Mathematics

We use **White Rose Maths** to support our planning. We will be covering:

- Numbers **0-10** – **comparing, composition, combining two numbers**
- Using vocabulary relating to quantity. E.g. more, less, fewer, same as, equal to.
- **Conceptual subitising** – quickly notice smaller quantities within larger quantities and saying the total without the need to count.
- Exploring more complex patterns.
- Exploring the properties of 3D shapes.
- Exploring measurement of time, weight, height length, capacity.

Continue to develop our number sense through mathematical thinking and talk. We use quality stories to introduce and reinforce mathematical concepts.

Reception Term 3 & Term 4 Explore!

We will continue to take inspiration from the interests and fascinations of the children. As part of the whole school **Explore** theme this term, our big question is:

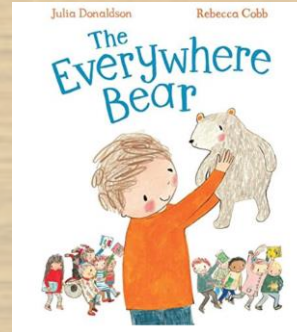
Where is the bear?
